COVID-19 vs. VKA BY ROLF HILL

VKA has won a few battles but not the war ... yet. Fremont and New Castle (p. 6) came off on schedule. LaFayette came off on May 28 (p.9) and Brodhead (p. 14), Avon (p.18) and Quincy were held as scheduled. We are keeping our fingers crossed that Springfield and the rest of the 2020 schedule will come-off without a hitch.

"Social distancing" and masks (off the track) are still a good idea. No contact and certified helmets are still REQUIRED (on the track).

20th ANNIVERSARY – PROMOTERS & TRACKS

Everyone remembers getting chased off parking lots or back streets. If not, just ask one of the "old-timers." (I remember a time my Mom took me to the top floor of a local department store parking garage. It was Sunday. In those days, stores were closed on Sundays. The local *gendarme* was nice, but firm. We left.)

Today, we run on many of the tracks that were built to address this problem and the growing interest in go karting. Some tracks may have been dirt. Others more "sophisticated" with asphalt and lights. Whatever they were, they were much safer ... and legal.

Bill McCornack is highlighting many of the tracks we use with an IKF history going back to the '60s (p. 23). But in VKA's 20th year, let's also remember the history of the tracks we use **today** and the promoters and track owners who get us on those tracks. (Input provided by promoters.)


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

LAFAYETTE SUMMARY BY KURT BOGERMAN

2020 has guaranteed no one anything but uncertainty. The Covid-19 pandemic, in addition to taking its toll on the bodies of those it sickens, has disrupted EVERYTHING from the availability of toilet paper to the celebration of the VKA's 20th Anniversary. Every intersection of human interaction has been impacted, from church congregations to prison popula-

tions, and our own gatherings are no exception. Months ago, when the event planning for 2020 was just getting underway, there were aspirations for a blockbuster, 20th Anniversary season opening event, with an all-star On June 25- 27, after cast. postponements and much juggling of the calendar, the Vintage Karting Association's Northeastern Region finally opened its 2020 season LaFayette Motorsports Park in LaFayette, New York, under the continuing specter of a viral pandemic.

As is typical for most of the VKA Northeastern Region's events this year, move-in and practice took place on Thursday. Personally, love Ι Thursdays. I am not a superstar of karting, so there is an appeal to taking the time to test and tune and practice without formality of organized Heats. (In fact, starting my third year of organized karting, vintage or otherwise. I still find that gridding up for the green flag is the most stressful part of my weekends. (Maybe I'm weird.) So, anyway... Thursday is a day when engines are broken in, gear ratios are selected, and tire pressures are adjusted. Some of the less performance-oriented participants, and several of our spouses, will often take advantage of these Thursdays for a spin at the more leisurely pace that is allowed by the loosely structured open track time. By all of these standards, Thursday was a success.

The staff at LaFayette is very good at keeping on schedule, so we were able to run two demonstration Heats on Friday, with ample time left to segue smoothly into the triple-header

of the Kart Show, the Wine and Cheese Tasting, and the live band, "The Vectors Lite". This was a festive evening. The track owners, Tony and Tina Goddard. treated us to a selection of New York wines and cheeses while our ears were tickled by The Vectors Lite's skillful covers of dozens of our favorite rock and folk songs from the 60s, 70s, and 80s. As the band played and the wines and cheeses were tasted (consumed?). Mark "Lumpy" Kaufman, Skip Owen, my wife Natalie, and I, were putting on the Kart Show. I made a point to walk the pits and encourage the members to bring their karts to the grid for display and judging. Once we had all the karts arranged in their class- ifications (or so we thought!), Natalie took charge of handling the Peoples' Choice Ballots while Lumpy, Skip, and I engaged in the harrowing process of deciding which beautiful karts were going to earn awards. It is not getting any easier, folks. The pride of vintage kart ownership is evident and prevalent! there is a standout, and at this event there were two that really captured the attention of involved. One was John Phippen's Cates kart and the other was Doug Jorgensen's minibike.

In addition to winning the award in the Historic category for his rare and beautiful Cates machine, John Phippen took home the 50/50. He wasn't finished winning

The Friday night kart show highlighted history and nostalgia, the mechanical and artistic skills, the attention to detail, and the thrill that we all get from our vintage racing

machines.

The evening was capped-off with a supurb catered dinner. We are all grateful for the assistance provided by the many volunteers who help make events like this possible.

Saturday morning, the sunny skies were replaced by pouring rain, so - who can blame us? - we all packed our gear and headed home. BRODHEAD SUMMARY BY BILL & MARY JO MCCORNACK

Beautiful Sugar River Raceway, with five ancient oak trees within the track circuit, is surely the most scenic setting for vintage karting events. The main straight-a-way is seven karts wide. Seventy-seven karts competed this year in Wisconsin's "pride of the Midwest" event — "The Brodhead Historics."

The weather on Thursday was clear with temperatures in the 90s. Friday cooled very little to about 85 degrees, partly cloudy but delightful when you were in the shade. Friday was also the busiest day with two Heats, the kart show, raffle, special awards and finally, a catered dinner. Saturday morning rains soaked the track, and since many karters were leaving, we decided to call it and give out the awards.

Our kart show, one of the best attended of VKA events, had about fifty entries. Our kart show is always well attended because it is always accompanied by a wine, beer and cheese tasting which is complimented by great music.

The 50/50 raffle generated \$425.00 for the VKA. The prizes included a McCulloch 49 engine, drill press, three cash payouts and other prizes. The biggest classes were the Sportsman Rear, Sportsman Sidewinder, Yamaha Piston Port and Yamaha Ltd. Sugar River Raceway typically has a big turn-out of McCulloch and West Bend engines but also had a good number of Yamaha and foreign engines.

Our hard-working staff consisted of Mike and Joann Morrall, Mike Morrall Jr. and Haley Morrall, Marshall Fairman, George Sellon and Sugar River Raceway's great staff.

THE GLORY YEARS OF KARTING BY BILL MCCORNACK

Part Two of this series focuses on the years 1964 – 1966: **Adams** – Riverside, CA (Adams Family); **Sugar River** – Brodhead, WI (Marshall Fairman); **TNT** – Quincy, IL (Traeder Family)

There is an interesting coincidence regarding the three tracks discussed in this issue: All three tracks are still owned and operated by the original families, they are all on the current VKA circuit and are part of the VKA 20th Anniversary Celebration.

THE 1964 GRAND NATIONALS



The 1964 Grand Nationals were held at Adams Riverside Raceway in Riverside, California. 360 entries competed in ten classes. The major players this year were Butch Stewart, Bob Allman, Ken Burden and Rex Hayes.

Banked turns were now the "in thing" and Adams featured two of them. (In 1961, Mansfield, Ohio had one also.)

"A cool, gray haze hung over the track on race day unlike the normal, warm sunny California weather (as described in Karting World Magazine).

"Karting World" sponsored a kart industry show at the Memorial Auditorium featuring a curvaceous blonde in a *gold lame*' outfit who opened the show and later handed out the trophies. One of the most popular features of the kart show was the McCulloch Service School that was held after the track closed each day.

THE 1965 GRAND NATIONALS



The 1965 Grand Nationals held in Brodhead, Wisconsin at Sugar River Raceway touted 350 entries in 10 classes. It was a C-open Who's Who of drivers - Pete Berlt, Ken Burden, Gary Emmick, Jim Whitehead, Don Surwall, Dick Collier, Ken Fox and Bill Wooland.


Brodhead introduced a few new things into the sport. Five huge trees grew (and still grow) within the track's circuit. Once again we quote Karting World who described the beauty of Sugar River Raceway as "set in the heart of Wisconsin's lush dairy country and located along a gently flowing river." There was also a sound-proof, air-conditioned control tower for the scoring team, an on-site kart shop and a real restaurant with great food! Blackhawk Karts were made on site and Fox Karts were manufactured only 50 minutes away in Janesville, WI. Oddly enough, less than an hour away was Rockford, IL, the site of the 1963 Grand Nationals.



THE 1966 GRAND NATIONALS

The 1966 Grand Nationals were held at TNT Kartways in Quincy, Illinois. There were 376 entries competing in 10 classes. Thirty-two states as well as Ontario, Canada were represented at this event.

Once again, ABC Wide World of Sports covered a major karting event (just as



they had in Rockford in 1963). Jim McKay and a large film crew came to Quincy to see the great spectacle. In order to film the karts at ground level, the crew dug four holes around the track's circuit. But unfortunately, five championships were determined by one Heat because the event was rained out.

The owner of TNT Kartways, Gus Traeder, was one of the big reasons karting grew in the 60s, 70s and 80s and again in this century with Vintage Karting. I think it's safe to say we all miss Gus.

And who won the B Limited class in 64, 65 and 66? Butch Stewart - one of karting's special racers.
